# WHERE WE WERE WHERE WE ARE NOW

The last two years have been challenging to say the least. It started with the assignment of a new Pastor who did not fit very well with our congregation. Unfortunately his style of teaching the Word was more in the line of accusing and blaming rather than caring and forgiveness.

A result of this was the decrease in attendance. Then came the Covid Pandemic, resulting in services being totally shut down. With very little income, and the high cost of keeping a Pastor assigned with full pay, we had to release this Pastor from his assignment to our Church.

As the Covid restrictions began to ease, we returned to having services using Lay Speakers and Guest Speakers from our local community. As a direct result of this, our attendance started to rise as well as giving. This caused us to review our affiliation with the United Methodist Church.

The worldwide United Methodist Church is currently undergoing a spiritual battle between liberal and conservative approaches to Christianity. This is a battle we as a Christian congregation were not interested in being involved.

We looked back at the origins of the Orwell Union Church, which reminded us that we were incorporated in 1844 as a Union Church. The Union was a result of Methodist, Congregationalist, and Presbyterian congregations coming together and building our Church which was dedicated in 1845.

In 1966 we entered into an agreement with the Methodist Church to be affiliated with them as the majority of the congregation was Methodist. However, we would remain a Union Church where all Christian denominations members were welcome to attend and become members.

In 2020 we updated our incorporation designation with the Oswego County Clerk. Our Federal ID number, tax exempt designation, property deed and bank accounts are all assigned to the Orwell Union Church.

This seems to have had a very positive effect on us as our attendance has continued to grow and our ability to support our community and participate in mission outreach has grown as well

October saw the return of the Coffee House to the Orwell Union Church. We all gathered for some great Christian music and fellowship. A great time was had by all. As Covid concerns wane we plan on



having more events like this in 2022.

### MEMORIAL FUND

In the last few years two of our long time members went on to their final reward and had designated that donations be made to the Orwell Union Church. We decided to honor them with the purchase of praise banners to be displayed in the sanctuary during the different seasons.

A total of 16 banners were purchased with the themes of Christmas, Easter, Summer and Thanksgiving. A special dedication was made at our Christmas Eve Service honoring the memory of Janet Minor Crast and Lois Robbins Potter.

An additional donation was received in memory of Alice Clark which was added to our Memorial Fund. It has been decided to develop a scholarship program using the Memorial Fund revenue. We will be working on developing this program in 2022.

Several years ago we started a special collection each week that was in addition to the regular offering. We call it the Noisy Can collection as it originally was started for the youth where change was collected. It has since grown into a wonderful way to support specific needs or missions.
