Did You Know?

As we are still uncovering the history of our Church, we continue to find interesting facts that tend to bring more questions.

The description of the Church building as it was dedicated in 1845 was a building 36' X 52'. That is the exact measurement of the present Sanctuary, minus the alcove and storage area to the rear and the front entrance to include the steeple. We surmised that these were part of the enlargement and repair of the Church which was undertaken in 1881.

Here lies the next new mystery. The Bell which is in the steeple was forged by the Mcneely Bell

Foundry in Troy, New York in 1852. There is no mention (so far) of when we acquired the bell or when it was



installed. We do know that the bell has served the town well as it was the main fire alarm before the installation of an electric siren.

During these improvements started in 1881 we see that the Bradley and Hubbard chandeliers were purchased at a cost of \$135 and 2 bracket lights to light the pulpit area were purchased for \$10. Also added was a pulpit set at a cost of \$112 plus \$5 freight. The Ladies Aid Society raised money for the stained-glass windows, carpet and pew cushions. Forty or fifty people put together and purchased the pipe organ for \$168. The total cost of all these repairs came to \$4,165.55.

CHICKEN BAR-B-QUE



EASTER and the EGG

Have you ever wondered why eggs are so identified with the Easter Season? There are many stories and theories, such as the egg symbolizes new birth and of things to come. While this is true, I prefer to see the egg as a symbol of the Trinity. The Bible can be very confusing at times like when it refers to the Trinity: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, Three in One.

When I was young, we used to have religious education in school every Thursday. The Pastor from this Church would come to our class and give us a lesson concerning religion. On one such day (about 60 years ago) he explained how the Holy Trinity could be, by using an egg as a visual example.

He held up an egg and asked, "How many things am I holding?". Of course, we all answered, "One!". He then said, "Are you sure?" as he broke open the egg and placed the white in one bowl, the yolk in another and the shell in a third. "Now how many things do I have?", we all said three.

The Pastor continued by explaining that the Holy Trinity is much like the egg. God the Father is like the shell, that protective layer that protects us and holds everything together. The Yolk represents God the Son, Jesus, who is the center of the Christian Faith and is the bright light that shines upon us all. Finally, we come to the Yolk which is like the God Holy Spirit. That clear but ever-present spirit that fills all of the voids in our lives.

I have carried this lesson in my heart for many years. When I am feeling empty or have a void in my life, I remember that Egg. The white, or Holy Spirit, is there to fill that emptiness. When my life feels dark, I recall the yolk, that ever-bright center of my Faith, Jesus, and He lights my path. Finally, when I am feeling vulnerable, I recall the Shell. That ever-protective layer that holds everything together and makes us One with God.
